SERIES	Beatitudes (Post-Easter)
BIBLE	Matthew 5:4; John 11:1-44; other texts
TITLE/TOPIC	Pt. 3 = Blessed Are Those Who Mourn
OVERVIEW	Going through a season of mourning can be one of the hardest things we do in this life. Whether it is because of the loss of a loved one, another kind of loss, or just simply longing for our eternal home, we all experience this hardship. Jesus promises us a future in which mourning will be gone forever. This future is found in the Kingdom of God.
SCRIPTURE BREAKDOWN	How Jesus Provides Comfort in Our Times of Mourning (John 11:1-44) Jesus Assures Us (v.1-16) Jesus assures those listening that God has a plan for Lazarus's illness—even if it leads to physical death. Jesus tells us that God can and will be glorified even through our seasons of pain. See also 2 Corinthians 5:1-5 Jesus Reminds Us (v.17-27) Jesus reminds Martha that a resurrection is coming soon, guaranteed because Jesus Himself is the source of resurrection and life. As with any reminder, Martha had to choose whether or not she would believe Jesus' words. We must do the same. See also 1 Corinthians 15:20-49 Jesus Joins Us (v.28-37) When Jesus saw the result of Lazarus's physical death and the pain it caused those around him, he didn't shun everyone for their reaction. He joined them. We must understand that Jesus joins us in our mourning as well. He sees what we are going through and knows the pain we are in. See also Hebrews 4:14-16 Jesus Lifts Us (v.38-44) Jesus doesn't just join us in our pain of mourning; he also has the ability to lift our spirits as we cling to him. In this story, Jesus lifts the spirits of Mary and Martha by performing a miracle—raising Lazarus from the dead. In our story, Jesus may choose to act differently. But as we cling to him, he will lift our spirits.
GOSPEL	 See also Isaiah 55:8-9; Psalm 27:5-6 Jesus came to this earth to join us in our struggle, but he also came to remind us and assure us of a way out of our struggle. Surrendering our lives to him is the only way to be ultimately lifted out of our struggle through the hope of eternal life.
