BIBLE	3:1-4:31
TITLE	#2: The God Who Calls
OVERVIEW	The book of Exodus is a story. A story about the rescue of God's people from the hands of the oppressors. It is a story of humans and spiritual forces coming in contact with the real God and finding out who is REALLY in charge. In our text today God calls Moses but He largely does so by identifying who HE is rather
	than what Moses is to do.
SCRIPTURE BREAKDOWN	The Backstory: The people of God are waiting for God to come and God first shows up not in Egypt but he calls out in the wilderness!
	God Speaks in the Unexpected! (Ex. 3:1-6) Moses is out in the wilderness, watching over his flock (just like the shepherds in Luke 2) and he notices a bush burning but not being consumed.
	Out of this unexpected vision, God calls out to him.
	We cannot only look for God to show up in our expected areas of life. God commonly communicates not in the seen but in the unseen, unexpected ways.
	He does this through identifying who He is! V.6 - I AM.
	The story of Exodus moves forward in this call.
	God Calls us into His Vision (Ex. 3:7-12) God acknowledges that he has seen the affliction of His people. He says, "I know their sufferings." God knows us and our lives. He sees our sufferings.
	V.8 - "I have come to deliver them"
	In this call God begins to help Moses see that he is being called into this vision of deliverance.
	When we open up our lives to hear from God in the unexpected, we begin to identify His vision for our lives.
	God Calls us into Uncomfortable Places (Ex. 3:13-22) God calls Moses not back into the palace of comfort that he was raised in but calls him into the uncomfortable place of calling Pharaoh out!
	In this call God again re-identifies who He is - VV.14-15.
	The story moves forward in God's identity calling Moses into a place of risk to trust Him.
	God's call for you is not reliant on who you are but on Who HE is!
GOSPEL	Luke 2 - The one who has come - the light in the darkness calling out is Jesus. Jesus calls us to trust Him and that He will work through us! Phil. 2:12-13

	"Therefore, my beloved, as you have always obeyed, so now, not only as in my presence but much more in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling, ¹³ for it is God who works in you, both to will and to work for his good pleasure."
