IN GROUP DISCUSSION GUIDE Lead Me, I'll Follow "Follow me..."

Jesus' call to "Follow me..." is relational. As fully devoted, fruitful followers, Jesus is calling us to be students of who He is and what He is doing (head), and to be totally transformed to be like Him (heart), so that we are living on mission with Him (hands).

Open: Who first shared the good news, the gospel of Jesus with you? What was your relationship with this person?

1. Looking at Matthew 4:17-22, describe what it looks and sounds like for a follower of Jesus to be ALL IN.

2. Why must a follower of Jesus not only learn what Jesus teaches but live how Jesus lives?

3. Read Luke 14:25-33. What costs are you counting in following Jesus as both Lord and Savior?

4. Jesus asks us to do three things to follow him: repent, believe, and be baptized. Have you turned from your sin, trusted in Jesus, and taken the step of baptism? If yes, explain. If no, why not?

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IN GROUP DISCUSSION GUIDE Shape Me, I'm Moldable "...and I will make you..."

Jesus' commitment to make us into fully devoted, fruitful followers is intentional. Jesus is calling us to be with Him and with one another in community (connect), to watch Him and work alongside Him (grow), and to be sent out together by Him to do the work that He did (engage) – all of which fills Him with joy!

Open: Share one thing you have made before - a special recipe, a piece of art, or other project. What was this process like?

1. Read Luke 6:40. What does it mean for Jesus to be above you? ...and for you to be "fully trained"?

- 2. Discuss this quote together: "God loves you just the way you are, but He refuses to leave you that way. He wants you to be just like Jesus." (Max Lucado) How are these words true for you?
- 3. Read Luke 10:1-9. What are some ways Jesus' followers connect, grow, and engage?

ALL GROUP DISCUSSION GUIDE Send Me, I'll Go "...fishers of men."

Jesus' call for us to be "fishers of men," or fully devoted, fruitful followers, is missional. Jesus is calling all of His followers (yes, you!) to make disciples by going, by baptizing, and by teaching. We are compelled by Jesus' love for us to call people to be reconciled to God through Jesus!

Open: Where do you see God most bearing fruit in your life and in the lives of others?

1. Read Matthew 28:18-20. What does it mean to make disciples by going? ...baptizing? ...teaching?

2. Is Jesus' command to go and make disciples for all people or only some people? Explain...

3. Read 2 Corinthians 5:17-21. Rewrite this verse in your own words and share it with the group.

BEGIN

Every journey has a starting point. In this step of your growth you are boldly stating that Jesus is the Lord of your life, and you are being obedient to Jesus' command to be baptized. In your baptism you are symbolically putting to death your old life, so that you can fully live out the new life you've been given in Jesus. **My NEXT STEP is to...**

CONNECT

THE BASICS OF SALVATION

A - ADMIT my sinful condition and need for salvation. God our creator is holy, loving and just (Exodus 34:6-7). He desires fellowship with us, and He loves to bless us (Psalm 103:1-5). Though humans were created in perfect fellowship with God, the first man Adam rebelled against God and brought sin and death upon all humans (Romans 5:12). Sin, any rebellion against God, is what separates us from God (Isaiah 59:2). I was born a sinner bv nature (Psalm 51:5). In mv life I have violated both mv Godgiven conscience and the revealed laws of God (Romans 3:14-15; Exodus 20:1-17). God is just and must punish all sin. (Exodus 34:7) God's just punishment for sin is death, eternity in hell (Romans 6:23; Matthew 25: 41; Revelation 21:8). Though I may have done some good in my life, I know my good deeds cannot earn salvation or cancel out my sins (Titus 3:4-5). Because of my sin I am deserving of God's punishment and can do nothing but ask for mercy (Romans 3:23; Luke 18:13-14). Sin destroys my mind, my body and my relationships. Because I believe these things about my sinful condition, I stop trusting in my own good deeds to save me and turn away from my sin.

B - BELIEVE the truth about Jesus Christ. Jesus Christ is God in human flesh (Colossians 2:9), who loved us and willingly died for guilty sinners (Romans 5:8). Jesus paid the death penalty that sinners deserved to pay (I Peter 2:24). Through His sacrifice, justice was served (Romans 3:25-26). God can now allow sinners to be forgiven and restored to Him when they repent of sin and trust in Jesus (Acts5: 31). We can be saved because of God's grace (undeserved favor), through faith in Jesus (Ephesians 2:8-9). Jesus forgives sins, gives sinners His righteousness and restores them to fellowship with God (2 Corinthians 5:21). Believing in Jesus for salvation means relying upon Him alone to make me a new person, give me new spiritual life, give a life of spiritual victory here and now (2 Corinthians 5:17; Ephesians 2:4-5; John 10:10) and one day bring me to eternity in heaven (John 3:16).

C - CONSECRATE myself to Jesus Christ by trusting and obeying His Word. I choose to trust and follow Jesus Christ daily, living for Him since He died for me (2 Corinthians 5:15). I will work out the free gift of salvation by letting God work in me (Philippians 2:12-13). I will let God renew my mind and transform my life by reading and obeying His Word (Romans 12:1-2; James 1:22). I will let the Holy Spirit bring changes to my character (Galatians 5:22-25). I will let God make me holy and accomplish His will through my life (Ephesians 2:10; Ephesians 4:22-24). I will celebrate God's grace and mercy by joining up with other believers who can encourage me to follow Jesus (Hebrews 10:24-25). I will give God glory by loving people and telling them about salvation in Jesus Christ (1 Peter 2:9-12).

HOW TO READ THE BIBLE

- **1. Set a Time:** Make an appointment with God that you intend to keep.
- **2. Set a Place:** Find a place free from distractions that allows you to focus on God.
- **3. Set a Plan:** Have an intentional strategy of what you will do during this time.
- **4. Choose a Partner:** Find someone who will ask you about how you are doing so that you can encourage one another and share what God is showing you.

Use S.O.A.P. When Reading the Bible

We read the Bible for more than just information. In order for God's Word to transform us we must reflect and meditate on what we are learning. S.O.A.P. is a simple approach to use when reading the Bible.

Scripture - What did I read?

Write down the date and passage you read from God's Word each day.

Observation - What did I see?

Write down a few notes of what impacted you from the passage.

Application - What will I do?

Write down a sentence for how you will take action on what you read.

Prayer - Ask God for help.

Write a short prayer asking God to help you put into practice what you learned.
